

The words "Lest We Forget" from the refrain of "Recessional". The phrase offers a warning about the perils of hubris and the inevitable decline of imperial power. The phrase later passed into common usage after World War I across the British Commonwealth especially, becoming linked with Remembrance Day observations; it came to be a plea not to forget past sacrifices, and was often found as the only wording on war memorials, or used as an epitaph.
